<p>The course aims to introduce students to theories and concepts associated with the analysis of contemporary public governance in a range of settings and elsewhere. It will explore the meaning of governance, and the impact of new public management, consumerism, joint up government and partnerships on the public sector and examine examples of unbundled government such as agencies and partnership working. It will draw on public policy analyses to examine the effect of change for example bureau shaping, policy networks, new institutionalism and policy transfer. Finally it will explore normative issues of how states can steer the policy process and how accountability can be maintained. The course will provide students with the opportunity to develop skills in applying theoretical concepts to empirical work and vice versa; in the assembly and presentation of primary empirical material and in small group work.
